	The committee shall conduct an annual review of the municipality's emergency management program and shall make recommendations to Council for its revision if necessary.

Accountability	This is a standing committee required by the provincial <i>Emergency Management and Civil Protection Act</i> and approved by Council.
	This committee is accountable to Council and shall advise Council on the development and implementation of the municipality's emergency management program as required.
Agenda	The agenda will be prepared by the Assistant Deputy Fire Chief in consultation with the committee members.
Attendance	If the primary representative cannot attend, they should send a suitable alternate.
Quorum	At minimum 50% plus 1 must be represented.
