Current accessibility essentially limits use only by city staff. Increased use of the second floor would result in additional income from a strategically located historic building. Use of the enhanced second floor would provide an excellent location for market related information, education and training programs involving local suppled foods. This is important as we are seeing food prices escalating. The report also includes enhancements to various aspects of the market which will result in better use of both inside and outside components of the market area. There will be both economic benefits to entrepreneurs and surrounding businesses and social benefits to citizens that come to the Market and the down town.

New or enhanced suggestions and ideas for the Cambridge Farmers' Market Note: The current Covid -19 pandemic has impacted every entity in the Cambridge downtown (Galt). The guidelines for successfully dealing with the pandemic developed and enforced by the Waterloo Health Unit have required significant adjustments and

restrictions to the normal operation of the Market. Comments and suggestions that follow are made under the assumption that the pandemic has been brought under control and the Market can resume normal and possibly enhanced operations. 1. Visibility and recognition. Most city buildings have modest signage and visitors look for the offices or outlets to conduct their business or attend events. The Market building houses a number of commercial vendors and passers by do not know what goes on or what is on offer unless they have attended the market been referred to the market or have seen advertisements or social media promoting the market. Enhanced signage on the building would enhance visibility, recognition and interest in the market. This has been raised in the past and should be assessed again. There are flags on poles on Dickson street. There should be flags posted, particularly during the summer. to create awareness and promote the market. An attractive " Market Notice Board" could be a focal point that would provide shoppers and visitors with information about the market, the vendors, seasonal recipes. special events and vendor "specials". 2. Building features. Recent renovations to the first floor has ensured that the facility meets current health and safety requirements. Regular update to various features ensures that the market is a desirable and safe place to shop and meet other citizens .Over recent years, investments in more tables and chairs for use by shoppers and visitors have added to their visits to the market. It would be beneficial to have vendors that could provide "ready to eat or take out" food. This feature could involve traditional take out but would provide opportunities for some groups to offer food from different backgrounds. 3. Building enhancements: There are draft plans done that would facilitate the use of the second floor of the market. The main component of the proposal is the installation of an elevator and some modifications to the second floor and an area at the front of the first floor. Main room on the second floor could then be used for cooking techniques, food preparation and storage. Workshops and educational programs could be offered on food selection and economics for market shoppers. Community organizations could rent the the upstairs rooms for specific events thus increasing revenue for the building. 4. Activities. In addition to the regular shopping activities, there are numerous additional activities that could enhance ones' experience at the Cambridge Farmers' Market. The list could include: - Food demonstrations and sampling - Seasonal food fairs involving local foods - Celebrations focused on specific foods - Entertainment by buskers and local talent groups - Food Bank involvement - information booth, food donation collections, recruiting volunteers - Special draws featuring local food from vendors - Photo days - Shoppers with their favorite food -Activities focused on particular demographics (children, youth and seniors) - Art at the Market - exhibits, demonstrations, draws and auctions - revenue for charity

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
