EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Purpose

This report provides information to Council on solicitations that have been awarded under delegated authority in accordance with Procurement By-law 19-187.

All awards completed under the delegated authority are in accordance with City policy.

Key Findings

Forty-seven (47) awards have been made under delegated authority, as outlined in Appendix A.

All awards completed under the delegated authority were within approved funding by Council.

BACKGROUND:

Procurement By-law No. 19-187 authorizes the Manager of Procurement to act as the legal Purchasing Agent and signing authority, within the prescribed limits of the bylaw, for the City of Cambridge.

The Manager of Procurement has the authority to award purchases up to \$500,000 pretax, within approved budgets. Purchases exceeding \$500,000 shall be awarded under delegated authority if certain conditions are satisfied, as outlined in section 7.2 of the bylaw.

ANALYSIS:

The City's Procurement Bylaw ensures the efficient and effective procurement of goods and services. To ensure accountability and transparency of the procurement function, section 5.5.13 of the bylaw includes a requirement for the Manager of Procurement to prepare a bi-annual report listing the procurements that have been awarded under delegated authority.

From July 1 – December 31, 2022, forty-seven (47) awards have been made under delegated authority, as outlined in Appendix A. The Manager of Procurement confirms that Procurement By-law No. 19-187 was adhered to in the issuing and awarding of each solicitation.

EXISTING POLICY / BY-LAW(S):

The Manager of Procurement, under section 5.5.2 of the Procurement By-law No. 19-187, is delegated the authority to award purchases up to \$500,000 pre-tax, within approved budgets. Tenders and Proposals over \$500,000 are awarded by the Manager of Procurement under delegated authority as per section 7.2 of the Procurement By-law when all of the following conditions have been satisfied:

 a. when there is sufficient funding, as approved by Council through the budget process and verified by the Finance Division by the Departmental Recommendation to Award Report.

- b. when all procedures in accordance with this By-law, have been followed; and
- c. when the lowest compliant Tender bid or highest scored Proposal is accepted and recommended.

Where all of the above criteria are present, the award is made under delegated authority.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The solicitations noted were approved by the Finance Division as being within their approved budgets. Total goods and services awarded under delegated authority, within the guidelines of the Procurement Bylaw, from July 1 – December 31, 2022 was \$21,771,007.

PUBLIC VALUE:

The public competitive bidding process ensures the City maintains an open and transparent public process that provides accountability on the utilization of financial resources
